REGULATIONS

- 1. ANYONE MAY ENTER** and there are no entry fees. Exhibitors may enter all classes for which they are eligible. Potted plants must have been in the possession of the exhibitor for a minimum of 90 days. All exhibitors will be responsible for filling out exhibit cards and placing their own entries.
- 2. GARDEN BOUQUETS** must be grown by the exhibitor. Children's arrangements must be their own creation.
- 3. ARTISTIC DESIGN** Each exhibitor is limited to one entry per class in Division I: Sections A and B.
- 4. ENTRIES MAY BE BOUGHT IN** Friday, April 13 between 3 pm and 7 pm or Saturday, April 14 between 7 am and 9 am. **Absolutely NO exceptions.** Exhibits must be ready for judging by 9 am on Saturday. All exhibitors and visitors must leave the exhibition area while exhibits are being judged.
- 5. EXHIBITS WILL BE ENTERED** by the rules of the plant societies sponsoring the Sections. If rules of these societies conflict with the rules of the Flower Show Association, the rules of the society will be followed.
- 6. SPECIMENS MUST BE ENTERED** according to schedule. Management reserves the right to readjust entries for the good of the Show. Separate sections may be set up if there are three or more entries.
- 7. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE** kept in good condition during the show. Exhibitors may enter at 10 am Sunday to care for the entries. Management will remove any entry not maintained in good condition.
- 8. AWARDS MUST REMAIN WITH EXHIBIT until the close of the Show.** No entry may be removed during the Show except by permission of the management. **All entries should be removed between 4 pm and 4:30 pm, Sunday, April 14.** The Management is authorized to dispose of any properties not called for by that time.
- 9. THE RIVERSIDE COMMUNITY FLOWER Association, Inc.** will exercise reasonable caution and care in safeguarding the entries. However, it cannot assume responsibility for injury or loss of any properties or materials, inclusive of garden tours.
- 10. ANY DISEASED OR** insect infested plant, potted or specimen, will be removed immediately.
